In-house Workshop for Soft skills training

The Progressive Education Society's Modern Law College not only aims at imparting education to the students but also provides ample opportunities for employee growth.

To augment and hone Soft skills, Modern Law College, organized an In-house workshop for the staff members for the overall development of their personalities. The objective of this workshop is to enhance the interpersonal skills of staff members and to groom them professionally, by strengthening their abilities to communicate effectively & efficiently.

The workshop was conducted on a weekly basis in two sessions for the law & non-law teaching staff members from 16 September to 04 November 2022.

Following are the details:

Lecture 1 – Lecture one was conducted on 16 September 2022 in the morning (10 to 11 am) and in the afternoon (3 to 4 pm). The trainer starts with an Ice breaking session with the trainees. The trainer further stated the importance of Communication Skills and how to initiate when interacting with one another. The trainees learned to introduce themselves and draft their profiles. The lecture was followed by questions from the participants.

Lecture 2 – The lecture second was conducted on 17 September 2022 in the morning (10 to 12 am) and the afternoon (3 to 2 pm). The lecture was initiated by the brainstorming session on spotting Errors. The trainer taught the grammatical errors when communicating with each other. The objective was to familiarize the trainees with the correct formation of sentences. In the second half of the

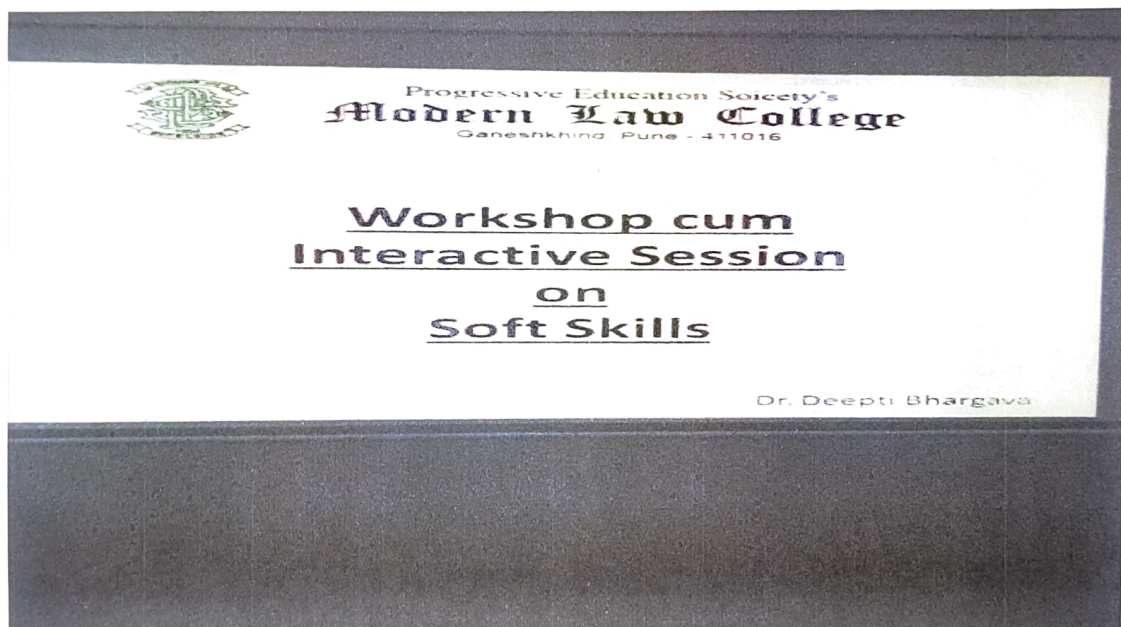
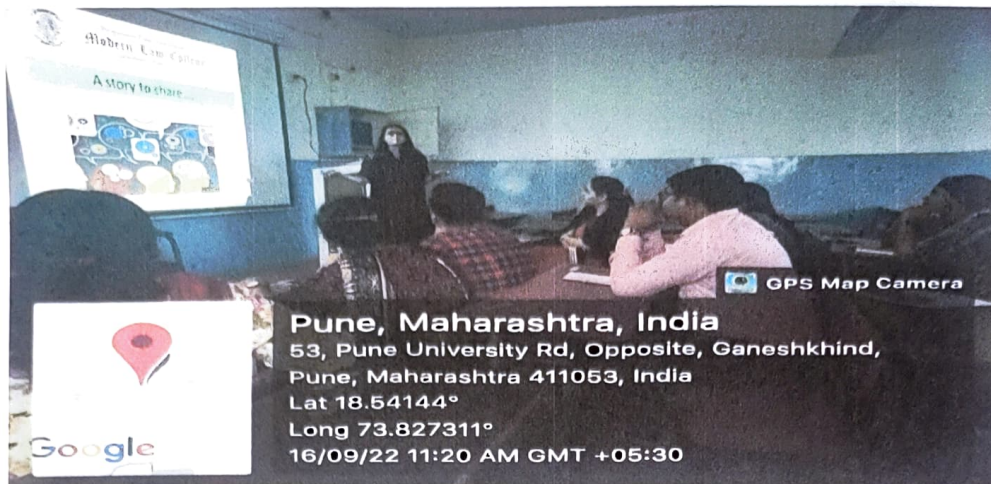
session, the trainer conducted a Group Discussion to exercise sentence formation among the trainees.

Lecture 3 – The lecture third was conducted on 23 October 2022 in the morning (10 to 11 am) and the afternoon (3 to 4 pm). The trainer started by emphasizing the importance of correct pronunciation in the English language. The lecture includes training in Phonetics which strengthens proper articulation and pronunciation. The trainees learned to articulate the vowel & consonant sounds properly. The Extempore was conducted to generate ideas and develop out-of-the-box thinking. The session was followed by the trainer's feedback for each trainee.

Lecture 4 - The lecture fourth was conducted on 24 October 2022 in the morning (10 to 11 am) and the afternoon (3 to 4 pm). The trainer taught me to spot the difference in homonyms, homophones & homographs. In the second half of the session, Role Play was conducted among the faculty members to hone their speaking skills. The session was followed by the trainer's feedback for each trainee.

Lecture 5 - The lecture fifth was conducted on 04 November 2022 in the morning (10 to 11 am) and the afternoon (3 to 4 pm). The trainer taught the Workplace etiquette to communicate effectively & efficiently. In the second half of the session, the trainer also taught the methodology how to deliver an effective lecture. The training program was followed by an interactive session with the trainer.

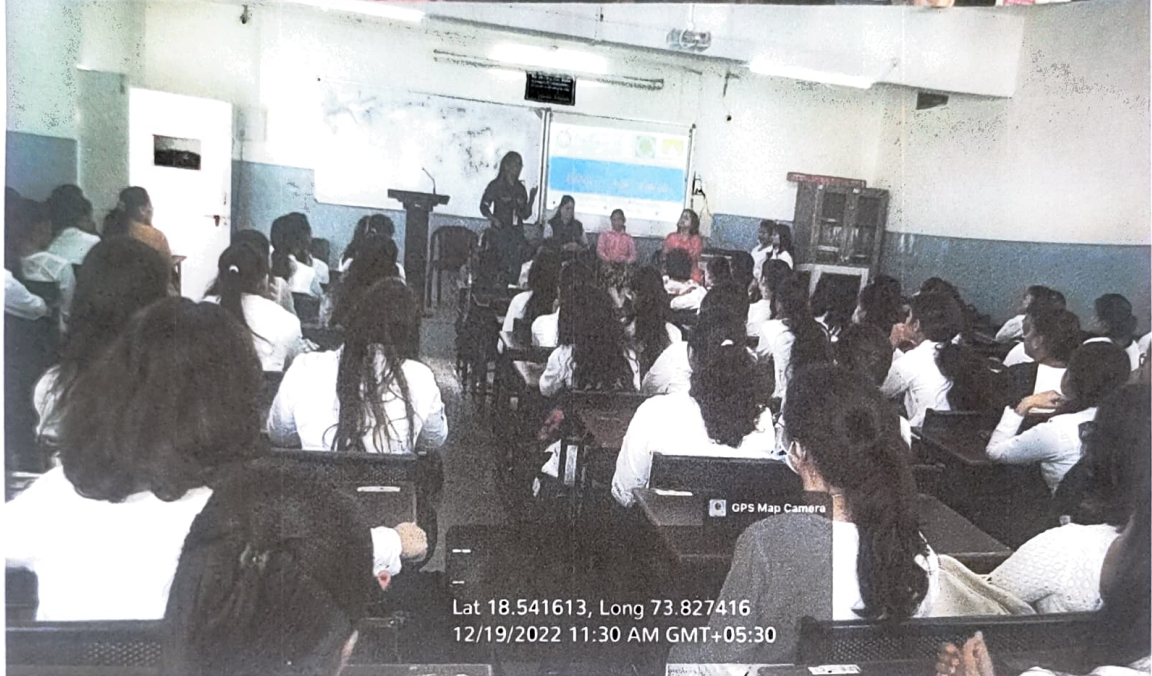

menstrual product usage and disposal methods were also conducted to promote eco-friendly and hygienic practices.

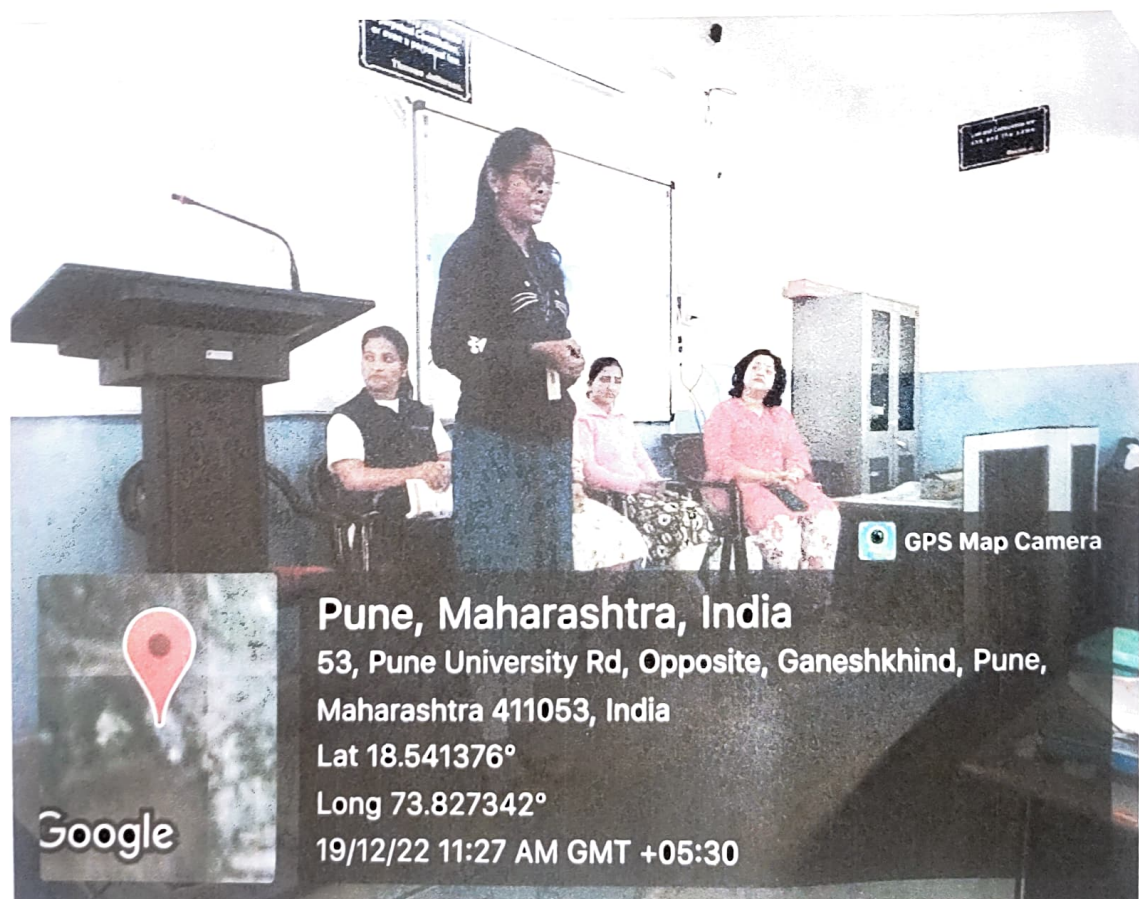

भारतीय स्त्री मुक्तीच्या व स्त्री शिक्षणाच्या प्रणेत्या, प्रथम शिक्षिका क्रांतिज्योती सावित्रीबाई फुले यांचा आज, ३ जानेवारी जयंतीदिन. स्त्री उद्धारसाठी आपले सर्वस्व वाहून देत महात्मा जोतिराव फुले यांनी हाती धेतलेल्या समाजोद्धारका वसा तितक्याच नेटाने पुढे नेणाऱ्या सावित्रीबाईंना जयंती दिनानिमित्त विनम्र अभिवादन.

भारताच्या स्त्री शिक्षणाची वांगोती म्हणून ओळखल्या जाणाऱ्या भारतातील पहिल्या मुख्याध्यापिका सावित्रीबाई जोतिराव फुले यांच्याविषयी आज आपण जाणून घेणार आहोत. यांचा जन्म सातारा जिल्ह्यात खंडाळा तालुक्यातील

नायगाव येथे ३ जानेवारी, इ. स. १८३१ रोजी झाला. आईचं नाव लक्ष्मीबाई तर वडिलांचं नाव खंडोजी नेवसे पाटील होते. त्यांचे वडील गावाचे पाटील होते. स्त्री स्वातंत्र्य नसलेल्या समाजात व काळात सावित्रीबाईंचा जन्म झाला. सावित्रीबाई या ९ वर्षांच्या असताना इ. स. १८४० मध्ये त्यांचा विवाह १३ वर्षे वयाच्या महात्मा जोतिबा फुले यांच्याशी झाला.

सावित्रीबाई या एक भारतीय समाजसुधारक, शिक्षणतज्ञ आणि कवी होती. आपले पती महात्मा जोतिबा फुले यांच्यासोबत त्यांनी भारतीय महिलांचे अधिकार सुधारण्यात महत्वाची भूमिका बजावली. सावित्रीबाईंना भारतीय स्त्रीवादची जाणनी मानले जाते. सावित्रीबाई भारताची पहिली महिला शिक्षिका, समाजसुधारक आणि भक्ती कवी होती. विद्यांचे पुनर्विवाह, अस्पृश्यता निर्मूलन, महिलांना शोषणातून मुक्त करणे तसेच पालित महिलांना शिक्षित करणे यासारख्या महत्वाच्या कार्यांसाठी त्यांनी केले.

२४ सप्टेंबर १८७३ रोजी अत्यशोधक समाजाच्या स्थापनेनंतर जोतिबांच्या निधनानंतर अत्यशोधक चळवळीचे नेतृत्व करण्यासाठी सावित्रीबाईंवर आली. १८९३ रोजी आसवड येथे झालेल्या 'अत्यशोधक परिषदे'चे अध्यक्षपद सावित्रीबाईंनी भूषविले. आपल्या विचारांचा प्रसार त्यांनी आपल्या साहित्याच्या माध्यमातून केला.

१८९७ मध्ये पुण्यात लिंगाच्या शाळीने येथे मान धातला होता. हा जीवघेणा भाजार अनेकांचे जीव घेत होता. त्यातून उद्भवणारे हाल ओळखून लिंग पीडितांची सेवा करताना सावित्रीबाईंनीही लिंग झाला. यातच १० मार्च १८९७ रोजी वयाच्या ६६ व्या वर्षी त्यांची प्राणज्योत मालवली.

Consumer Court Visit

A group of over 40 students of the Modern Law College, Pune had the opportunity to visit consumer court at (place) to gain firsthand experience of the legal proceedings and the consumer grievance redressal system on 15th March, 2023. This visit was an integral part of their curriculum, aiming to provide them with practical insights into consumer rights and the judicial mechanisms in place to protect these rights.

Upon arrival, the students were greeted by a court official who briefed them on the court's history, its jurisdiction, and the types of cases typically handled there. The court session they observed involved a dispute between a consumer and a large electronics company over a warranty issue. The case provided a clear insight into the procedural aspects of filing a complaint, the presentation of evidence, and the arguments made by both parties' legal representatives.

The presiding judge took an educational approach, pausing at times to explain legal principles and procedural norms to the students. This interactive session not only demystified the legal process for the students but also highlighted the importance of consumer laws in safeguarding consumer interests against malpractices.

Post-session, students engaged in a Q&A session with the judge, gaining valuable advice on pursuing a career in consumer law. This visit significantly enriched the students' understanding of consumer rights and the legal process, emphasizing the practical application of their theoretical studies. Asst. Prof. Susmita Vadhavkar was in charge of the event.

Meteorological Department (Simla Office) Visit

The Modern Law College, Pune organized a visit to the Meteorological (Simla) Office, Shivajinagar. A group of 25 students gained invaluable insights into the intersection of meteorology and legal studies, particularly in environmental law and policy on 23rd March 2023. 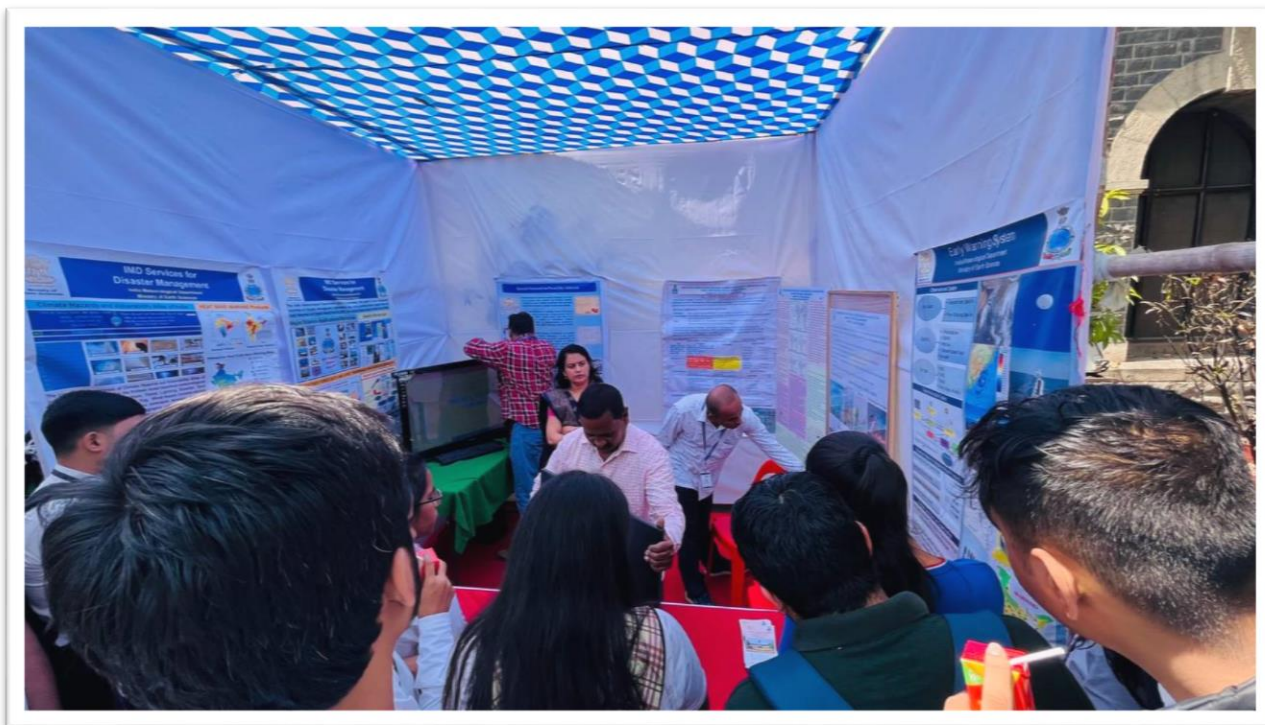

Report: Yerwada Central Jail Visit

On receiving the letter of permission from Yerwada Central Jail authority pune, 35 students with two faculty members Asst. Prof. Akshay Kabra and Asst. Prof. Archana Deshpande went on Jail visit on 21st Oct. 2023. We all assembled in front of Yerwada Jail at 11.30am.



Senior Jailor Mr. Kande Sir and Jailor Mr. Revananath Kanade sir received us at entrance gate and gave a brief introduction of Yerwada Jail. Then they instructed to make two different groups of boys and girls. One group of boys with male faculty was headed towards Yerwada Central Jail and Girls group with female faculty member headed towards Yerwada Women Central Jail.

At Women Central Jail Jailor Pilave welcomed students. Head Constable Mrs. More noted the details about the visit in their register. Students visited kitchen and other areas of jail. Few inmates were engaged in the preparation of food in the kitchen. Other female inmates were busy in making essence sticks (Agarbatti) and parts of the vehicles. There was interaction between our students and head constable Mrs. More. She gave satisfactory answers of each question asked by the students.



At Yerwada Central Jail, Jailor Revananath Kanade sir along with two constables took boys group with faculty inside jail. Student's security check was done and ID cards were given to students. Students were visited different wards like – Video Conferencing Court, Tilak Yard, Kitchen, and Hospital. Students also visited under trial prisons cell, etc.

Jailor Revananath Kanade sir has explained about Poona Pact which was an agreement between Mahatma Gandhi and Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar on behalf of Dalits, depressed classes, and upper caste Hindu leaders on the reservation of electoral seats for the depressed classes in the legislature of British India in 1932. It was made on 24 September 1932 at Yerwada Central Jail in Poona, India.

As Yerwada Central Jail considered as a historical place because freedom fighters such as Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, Mahatma Gandhi, Lokmanya Tilak, and Padit Jawaharlal Nehru, etc were kept as prisoner. Jailor Revananath Kanade sir shows us the place at which Poona Pact made. Thereafter, Sir gave motivational speech students and wished for good success.

The visit came to an end at 02.10pm and we left the premises at 2.30pm after photograph with jail authorities. It was an informative, interesting and successful visit. As students of BA.LL.B. V and LL.B III year law course, students learned about prison system, prison rules, corrective measures in criminal justice system.

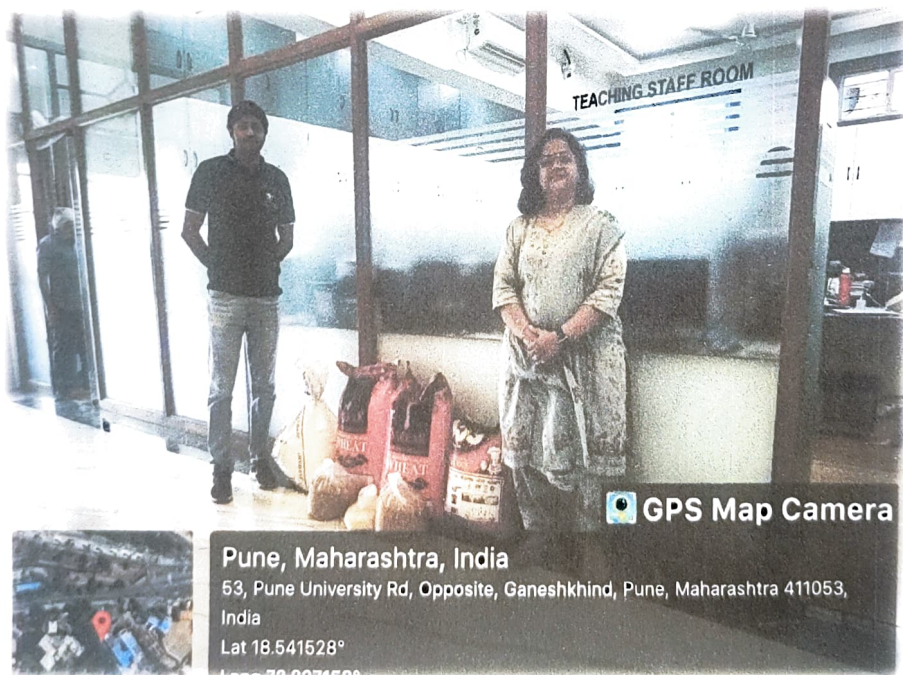

Report on CID Visit

Venue: - CID Department, Ganeshkhind, Pune.

Date and Time: - 4 and 6 January 2018, 11.00 a.m.

Introduction: - Modern Law College arranged a visit to the Crime Investigation Department (hereinafter “the Department”) from 02 January 2018 to 06 January 2018. The visit was arranged by the College in response to the letter received by the College from CID Dept. on 29 January 2017. The visit was occasioned by the celebration of ‘Raising Day’ by the Department which took place from 2 January 2018 to 8 January 2018. The purpose of this celebration was mainly to promote dialogue between the police and the general public.

The Department of Maharashtra is headquartered in Pune at Pashan Road, right next to the College. The purpose of the visit was to understand the working of the Department, fingerprint analysis .

The vision of the Department to make Maharashtra the safest State in India. They are guided by the motto of “finding wrong to discover the truth”.

Working of CID:-

The Department is the investigation wing of the Maharashtra State Police. The investigation process adopted by the Department as well as the local police is the same. However, the Department only comes into picture when the investigation is of complicated nature or has interstate/ interdistrict complications.

The Additional Director General of Police, CID, and Maharashtra State is at the head of the organisational set up of the Department. Further, there are various Inspectors General looking mainly after, inter alia, the East Zone and West Zone crimes. The Organisation is further divided into various Superintendents.

Complaints from a citizen are not directly accepted by the Department. Investigation of offences already registered at Police Stations is handed over to the Department by the Government of Maharashtra, Director General of Police, Maharashtra State or Courts.
